BEAUTY OF BROKENNESS

Kintsugi is an ancient Japanese art of repairing broken pottery. Its philosophy celebrates flaws and mistakes by turning them into an aesthetic concept. Damage is not hidden, but accentuated. (Source: Internet) You may have heard about this, but it caught my attention when a preacher mentioned about this art. This art illustrates for us a major theological concept or one of the ways God works in our lives during the transformative process of becoming like Christ.We are all broken under the power of sin (Romans 3:9-11, 23) and none of us are perfect.



But when we encounter Jesus on the cross and understand His sinless death for our sakes and begin to follow Him, we enter into the process of being remade and restored.

In life we experience brokenness in the areas of Relationships, Health, Death of loved ones and friends, Loneliness, Rejection, Abuse (Physical, Verbal, Emotional), Broken dreams, Financial Disappointments, stresses. Depression, Mistreatment, etc. The memories and scars of experiencing brokenness are the very pieces the Lord uses to create beauty in our lives from the inside out. In Jeremiah chapter 18:1-4, we read, "This is the word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord: 2 "Go down to the potter's house, and there I will give you my message." 3 So I went down to the potter's house, and I saw him working at the wheel. 4 But the pot he was shaping from the clay was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as seemed best to him."

The marred clay in the hands of the potter are the broken pieces which the Lord uses to create the beautiful character of Jesus in our lives.

In Romans 9:21, it is written, "21 Does not the potter have the right to make out of the same lump of clay some pottery for special purposes and some for common use?" Though we may not understand the broken experiences of life, we can conclude that the master creator is re-creating a masterpiece to achieve His divine purposes. We need to experience brokenness in order to be restored into a unique vessel or pot for the Lord to use for His glory. May we stay in the hands of the potter and be remade and restored through our broken experiences for the Lord to shine His glory.


